As we reflect on the past year at Volunteer Manitoba, we are reminded once again of the extraordinary role volunteerism plays in shaping strong, connected, and resilient communities across our province.

This year has been marked by organizational growth, ongoing opportunities for connection and collaboration, and an unwavering commitment to supporting both volunteers and the non-profit organizations that rely on them every day.

2026 marks the **International Year of the Volunteer**—a significant global milestone that recognizes the essential contributions of volunteers worldwide and calls for renewed commitment to strengthening volunteerism for the future. This year has also been pivotal in advancing the **National Volunteer Action Strategy**, a collaborative effort to better understand, support, and grow volunteer engagement across Canada. The strategy aims to create a shared vision for the future of volunteerism by strengthening supports for volunteers and non-profit organizations, addressing barriers to participation, and helping communities build sustainable pathways for civic engagement in the years ahead. Together, we continue to shape a final strategy that will be launched later this year.

Throughout the year, **Volunteer Manitoba continued to expand and strengthen the programs, workshops, and initiatives we offer to the non-profit sector.**

We introduced several new learning opportunities and supports aimed at volunteer engagement professionals, non-profit staff, and organizational leaders. From leadership development, advanced board governance and volunteer management training to networking opportunities and vital sector conversations, our focus has remained on building capacity and helping organizations navigate an increasingly complex environment.

Volunteer Manitoba's expanded outreach initiatives created meaningful opportunities to connect with even more communities and regions across the

province, delivering presentations and hosting events that allowed us to strengthen our relationships, listen to local needs, and raise awareness of volunteerism across Manitoba. A huge thank you to all of our community partners and collaborators, and for everyone who welcomed us with open arms!

The 42nd Annual Volunteer Awards was once again a powerful celebration of the individuals and groups who make Manitoba stronger through their generosity, compassion, and commitment to community. THE VM WEBSITE

Our website has been a great resource for Manitobans looking for volunteer opportunities. The website serves as the first point of contact and shows up as the number one item in Google searches for "Places to volunteer in Manitoba" and "Where to volunteer in Winnipeg". For Newcomers, our website eliminates the quest to decipher between a non-profit/ charitable organization versus a for-profit organization because we vet and approve all positions we host on our website. In the past year, the website (www.volunteermanitoba.ca) reached **632,746 page views**. Volunteer opportunities are posted by hundreds of organizations across Manitoba every year!

REFERRALS

Through collaboration with community organizations and dedicated volunteers, the referral service plays an important role in connecting individuals with meaningful volunteer opportunities across Manitoba. Strengthening community engagement and supporting local initiatives. A total of **296 referrals** were made, reflecting valuable pathways for individuals looking to make a difference while helping non-profit organizations find passionate volunteers to support their important work.

RBC: INVESTING IN MANITOBA'S NON-PROFITS

RBC's **Stronger Non-profits Program** recognizes that thriving communities depend on strong non-profit organizations. Volunteer Manitoba is honoured to partner with RBC on this program, which is a national initiative focused on strengthening the resilience and long-term sustainability of Canada's non-profit sector. This investment represents an important recognition of both the critical role Manitoba's non-profit sector plays in our communities, and Volunteer Manitoba's leadership in supporting and strengthening the people behind this work.

At a time when non-profit organizations across the province continue to face increasing demand, workforce pressures, leadership burnout, and growing operational complexity, this support arrives at a pivotal moment. Funding through the **RBC Stronger Non-profits Program** has enabled Volunteer Manitoba to expand opportunities for non-profit leadership capacity building locally, including creating and strengthening peer networks for Executive Directors and senior leaders, while also delivering advanced governance training and workshops designed to support high-performing, future-focused boards.

As Manitoba's non-profit sector continues to evolve, strong leadership and effective governance have never been more important. This investment will help create spaces where non-profit leaders can connect, collaborate, and build the skills needed to lead sustainable and impactful organizations. By investing directly in leadership development and governance capacity here in Manitoba, this partnership will have a meaningful and lasting impact on the strength, resilience, and future of our province's non-profit sector

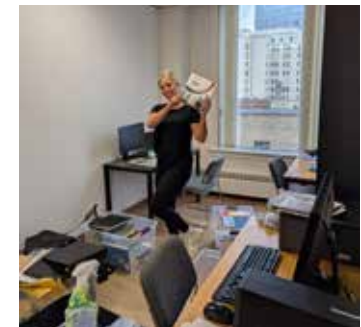
BOARD CONNECT: Matchmaking... for boards!



Our Board Connect program continues to be a popular way for non-profits to recruit new board members, while also supporting individuals who are interested in serving on a board with the training and connections they need to get started.

This year, we hosted **three Board Connect workshops**. These sessions provided participants with an introduction to the roles and responsibilities of being a board member.

On the other side of the "match," we have **more than 80 non-profit organizations** registered with us in search of new board members, highlighting a strong demand for engaged and skilled governance volunteers.



NEW OFFICE FOR VM!

Last summer marked an exciting new chapter for Volunteer Manitoba as we officially moved into a new office space designed to better support the growing needs of our organization, our staff and volunteers, and the non-profit sector as a whole.

As Volunteer Manitoba continues to expand programming, partnerships, and sector leadership initiatives, it became increasingly important to have a space that reflects both our growth and our commitment to collaboration. Our new office provides additional room for staff and volunteers to work more effectively, while also creating welcoming gathering spaces where non-profit professionals can connect, meet, learn, and collaborate.

We hosted an Open House event in September 2025, where we invited guests to visit our new space.

This move represents an important investment in Volunteer Manitoba's future and in the continued growth and resilience of the non-profit community we proudly serve.



GRANT CONNECT:

We were able to offer free access to Grant Connect a powerful fundraising research tool that helps non-profits discover new funding opportunities. This year, we welcomed 34 non-profit organizations into our office to use the platform.

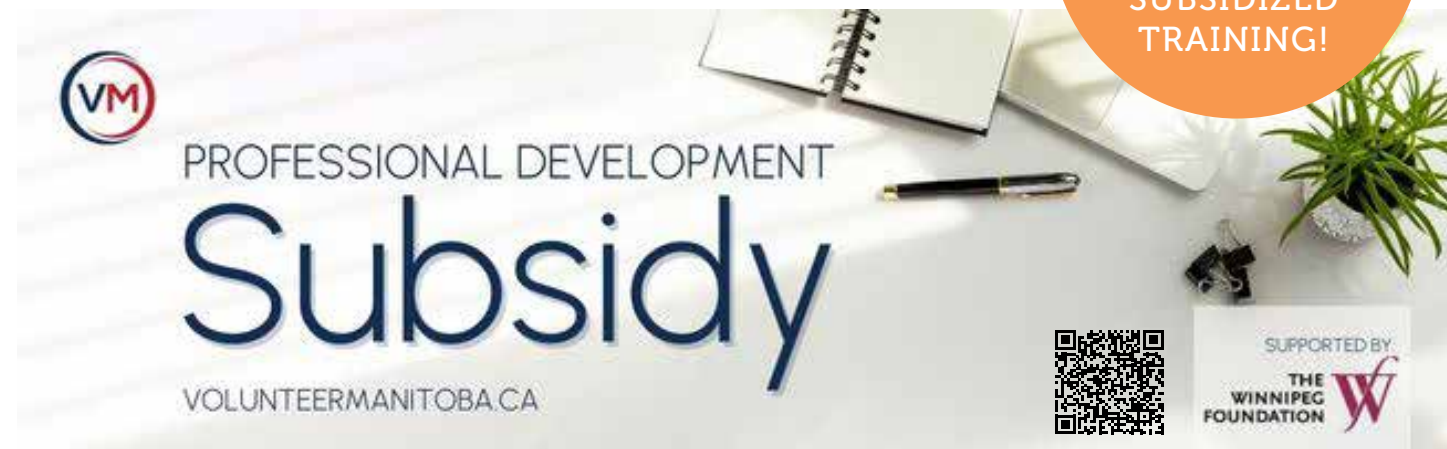

TRAINING FOR THE NON-PROFIT & CHARITABLE SECTOR

This past year was a success for our training department! We delivered **117 Workshops**, equipping **1,786 staff and volunteers** across the sector with new skills, stronger networks, and greater confidence in their roles.



Subsidy Program: Expanding Access to Training!

Thanks to the generous support of The Winnipeg Foundation, we are proud to offer subsidized training opportunities to non-profits across Manitoba for the second consecutive year. This funding made it possible for **52 organizations** to access professional development opportunities that may have otherwise been financially out of reach.

The Subsidy Program has truly made an impact across Manitoba’s non-profit sector. **More than 100 participants joined our training opportunities this year**, including many organizations that had never previously engaged with Volunteer Manitoba.

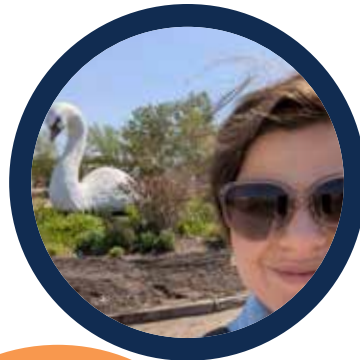
The program helped remove financial barriers and created new opportunities for organizations to invest in learning.

Through the Subsidy Program, we were also able to provide customized group training. **16 non-profit organizations** took advantage of this opportunity, allowing us to deliver training that directly reflected their unique needs.

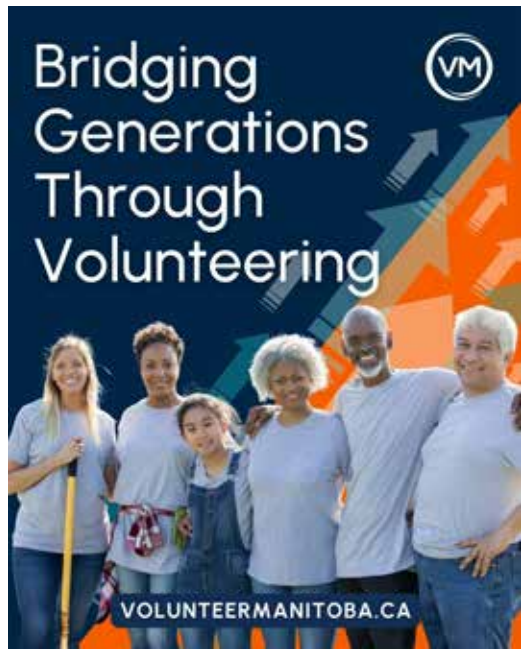

We remain committed to keeping our professional development opportunities fresh and relevant.

To ensure our training opportunities remain relevant, we actively engage with the sector by attending networking events, conferences, and community gatherings. We also collaborate closely with subject matter experts to better understand best practices within their fields.

Together, these conversations help shape a strong lineup of workshops!

Leadership Development and Emerging Leaders

Our leadership development programs continued to play a key role in strengthening the non-profit sector by supporting both current and future leaders.

We delivered our Summer and Winter Emerging Leaders Program, welcoming 25 participants who are just beginning their leadership journeys in the non-profit sector.

For the second year in a row, the Advanced Non-Profit Leadership Training brought together a cohort of 14 Executive Directors and senior leaders. This program creates a space for peer learning and strengthening senior leadership.

In addition, we worked with University of Manitoba Students' Union and the Assiniboine College Students' Association, providing students with their first introduction to board governance training. Developing our emerging leaders in the field!

Volunteer Manitoba continues to be the leader and the connector of volunteer engagers in Manitoba.

We are proud to create opportunities for volunteer engagers to connect and learn best practices in the field.

VM YOUTH PROGRAM

Our Youth Program has proven itself to be a valuable resource for youth, organizations, educators, parents, and communities throughout the province. Our youth program includes hosting student recruitment fairs, conducting youth outreach, delivering presentations, and offering referrals.

In addition to the student recruitment fairs, 51 interactive youth presentations were delivered throughout the year to schools and community groups across Manitoba. Feedback from educators consistently highlighted the positive interaction and high level of student participation during these sessions. Many noting that discussions and inspiration in volunteering continued well after the presentations concluded. Teachers identified Volunteer Manitoba's online volunteer portal as a valuable and ongoing resource used to help students access volunteer opportunities and connect directly with non-profit organizations.

STUDENT RECRUITMENT

Student Recruitment is a yearly undertaking that allows non-profit organizations and students to interact and potentially match up to volunteer.

Our post-secondary partners include Brandon University, Assiniboine College, University of Manitoba, University of Winnipeg, Manitoba Institute of Trades and Technology, l'Université de Saint-Boniface, Red River College Exchange District and Notre Dame Campuses, and our new high-school partner Glenlawn Collegiate Institute.

In partnership with **Glenlawn Collegiate Institute**, we created a dynamic space for 1,000 students to engage directly with 12 organizations, ask questions, and discover volunteer roles aligned with their interests and future goals.

Leading up to the fair, Volunteer Manitoba delivered classroom presentations focused on the value of youth volunteerism. These sessions highlighted how volunteering contributes to stronger communities, develops leadership skills, explores potential career interests, and contributes fresh energy to the non-profit sector.
