It's been another incredible year at Volunteer Manitoba, and though it didn't end the way any of us had planned, we are very proud of all we accomplished in 2019-20.

> Thanks to support of our funders, we were able to increase our own capacity in order to better serve our community. We welcomed 2 new staff to the team this year, opened a non-profit drop-in space, hosted a special event to learn more about youth programming across the province, increased the reach of our training, strengthened our relationship

with volunteer managers, and celebrated volunteerism in this fabulous province of ours!

In 2019-20, we delivered training in over 25 communities across Manitoba and supported the non-profit sector through our board governance, volunteer management, and capacity building knowledge and expertise.

Volunteer Manitoba's training, and facilitators, continue to be popular within the sector and the success of our training department is in no small way attributed to the staff's commitment to monitoring trends, both locally and nationally, and developing outstanding courses and resources as a result.

We also welcomed Corinne Napper as our new Training Program Assistant this year. Corinne has been instrumental in the growth of our training department and a wonderful addition to our team.

This past fall we launched our new Non-Profit Drop-In Centre, for organizations to use as a meeting space, access resources, or search for grant information. Sarah Chan joined our team as our new Community Relations Coordinator, and she now oversees the Drop-In space and coordinates our Board Connect program. We've already seen an increase in our board matches thanks to Sarah, and she is proving to be fantastic at volunteer referrals.

We know that youth have a high rate of volunteer engagement, and we felt it was important to elevate our youth program to increase our support of the next generation of volunteers. The new VM Youth Advisory Committee brings together those working with youth, and for youth, to help guide and support us in our efforts to advance youth programming and leadership in Manitoba.

To better understand youth programming in Manitoba, we brought over 90 organizations together for our first ever VM Youth Hub. Youthserving agencies learned more about programming for youth, as well as the challenges, gaps and opportunities for collaboration. We look forward to sharing the results of these conversations soon.

We were especially thrilled to partner with RBC Future Launch and Manitoba 150 on our MB 150 Youth Ambassador Program. The participating youth were asked to showcase their communities through storytelling and it has been an absolute pleasure to watch their journey through this program, and their

The coronavirus pandemic has changed the way we work overnight, and possibly for a long time to come. But despite our initial fears that the pandemic would shutter thousands of workplaces, many have been able to find a way to adapt in the interim.

In March, Volunteer Manitoba made the difficult decision to close our offices and staff began working remotely. Our team continued to deliver prompt service and communications to our community, program participants, partners and funders. We committed to taking the appropriate precautions in order to provide a safe environment that did not put anvone at undue risk.

By closing down all in-person programs, and rescheduling our special events and training, we contributed to Manitoba's recovery, and helped to flatten the curve and slow the spread of COVID-19.

One out of every two people in the province donates their time, but what is truly amazing is how those hours are spent. Coaching youth. Feeding the homeless. Visiting the sick. Cleaning up parks. Teaching literacy. Sitting on boards and committees. Running festivals. Maintaining frontline services.

The work of the almost 7000 non-profits and charities in Manitoba is only possible because of this powerful force for good. As the only volunteer centre in our province, it's our job to foster and develop volunteerism in the community.

For over 40 years, Volunteer Manitoba has been promoting and celebrating volunteers and volunteerism across the province of Manitoba. We do this by encouraging people to volunteer their time and by promoting volunteer opportunities. We also work with groups and organizations to help enhance and promote their recruitment of volunteers.

We love the work we do because we believe that volunteering is a great way to connect with your community, explore career options, share your passion with others and create change in the world.

Every year, an average of 12.7 million Canadians contribute over 2 billion volunteer hours, and here in Manitoba we have the 2nd highest rate of volunteerism in Canada (52%)!

Volunteer positions are posted by HUNDREDS of organizations across Manitoba every year!

Through our Community Outreach activities, we are able to connect with Manitobans on the benefits of volunteerism.

We attend outreach events throughout Manitoba and also visit with classrooms, community groups and organizations to deliver presentations on community engagement and how to find the right volunteer opportunity.

For over a decade, The Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce and Volunteer Manitoba have partnered together to offer Leadership Winnipeg.

a 10-session leadership program (plus class project), which runs from September through June. The program provides experiences that inspire and help individuals to develop an understanding of themselves, their community and their role within it. The day-long sessions, held once a month, are hosted in the community and focuses on a theme. The sessions include tours and guest speakers, plus an opportunity to interact with those speakers. The program is primarily learning by experiencing as opposed to textbook-based learning. A portion of the day is also devoted to leadership development – providing the tools that will enhance the participant's communication, facilitation, collaboration and time management skills.

BOARD CONNECT

Board Connect, presented by the Winnipeg Foundation, creates an avenue for boards, or standing committees, to recruit engaged and motivated leaders who are prepared to serve. The program matches skilled leaders with boards or standing committees for a year, after which further continuation of the placement is decided by the organization and the participant.

The Board Connect program aims to achieve the following outcomes;

- Provide participants with the opportunity to expand their skills and contribute leadership to a community organization.
- Engage the next generation of leaders to ensure continuous capacity building and long-term sustainability.
- Create a network of talented and resourceful emerging leaders who will establish strong and lasting relationships that are personally and professionally beneficial.
- Connect non-profit leaders with professionals with the skills, experience and social capital to help them be successful.
- Serve the community's need for effective, highly-skilled and energized leadership.
- Increase awareness of non-profit agencies and develop a sustained commitment among emerging leaders to their communities.

TRAINING

Throughout the year, Volunteer Manitoba delivers effective, relevant and engaging training for boards, staff and volunteers. Our training is designed to help increase skills, build confidence, and provide opportunities to network with others in the non-profit sector.

Leveraging a network of facilitators across the province, and increasing our reach by using technology to offer our workshops online, our training helps those working in our sector come up with new ideas, understand best practices, and access the tools and resources needed to build capacity.

Training Highlights from 2019-20

Connect for Synergy In May, three staff traveled to Ottawa for the week-long 2019 LiVE- Leaders in Volunteer Engagement Conference, and the Volunteer Centre Leadership Forum - hosted by members from the Professional Association of Volunteer Leaders-Ontario's (PAVRO), Volunteer Management Professionals of Canada (VMPC) and Volunteer Canada. Volunteer Manitoba staff not only attended, but also facilitated two sessions at the conference, and brought back a wealth of resources and knowledge to ensure that we can support and advocate for volunteer management professionals in Manitoba. In June we hosted our first Connect for Synergy event with volunteer managers, sharing what we learned at the conference, along with feedback from other volunteer engagement professionals on the challenges and successes being experienced across Canada.

Volunteer Management Hybrid Conference

In October, Volunteer Manitoba hosted The Future is Now, a volunteer management conference presented by ALIVE, Better Impact, and VMPC (Volunteer Management Professionals of Canada). In its fifth year, this year's topic explored how leaders of volunteers can move from managing to leading. The streaming event consisted of a keynote presentation, followed by a moderated discussion with the other presenters (think TED talk meets late night tv), including responding to guestions from the audience. As a host site for the conference, discussion of each of the topics was facilitated by Volunteer Manitoba to help volunteer managers in Manitoba connect in-person with other volunteer engagement professionals.

Launch of Emerging Leaders Program

Last spring, we piloted our new Emerging Leaders Program, a program specifically designed to build leadership skills for those who are taking the next steps to pursue or advance their management career in the nonprofit sector. We received excellent reviews and we are happy to be offering the entire program again this fall.

VM's Non-Profit Drop-In Centre is a free space available for non-profits, charities and grassroots organizations to work, research, network and collaborate. Our goal is to provide a place for organizations and individuals to use and access services that support and build the capacity

of the Non-Profit Sector in Manitoba.

Along with basic administration services, those who work in the non-profit sector can also book the space for board or committee meetings, access the resource library for information on a variety of subjects, and search the Grant Connect database of grants available in Canada (developed by Imagine Canada).

For the past 11 years, Volunteer Manitoba has hosted our annual Student Recruitment Fairs at post-secondary institutions across Manitoba. Non-profit organizations, charities, and community groups join us on campus for a day of volunteer recruitment from each student body. The SR Fairs are an excellent way for students to connect with organizations who are actively recruiting. and gain valuable experience to help them in their future careers.

This year we returned to Red River College - Notre Dame, as well as the University of Winnipeg, the University of Manitoba, the Manitoba Institute of Trades and Technology (MITT) and the Université de Saint Boniface. Over 36 organizations participated (and a waitlist was created due to high demand!)

VM YOUTH

We brought together over 90 organizations and groups who deliver youth programs from across our province. YOUTH **OUTREACH**

Volunteer Manitoba participates in community events across Manitoba throughout the year. We visit classrooms, community groups and organizations to deliver engaging presentations that are designed to motivate and assist youth in their volunteer efforts.

In 2019-20, Volunteer Manitoba participated in 35 community outreach events, including Brandon's annual career fair, the Youth Agencies Alliance Conference, Springfield Collegiate in Oakbank, and East Selkirk Middle School. Volunteers and staff delivered 20 presentations to high schools in Manitoba.











Volunteer Manitoba, in partnership with RBC Future Launch and Manitoba 150, launched a new program giving young Manitobans an opportunity to showcase their community through creative storytelling. The 20 youth who participated in the MB 150 Youth Ambassador program this year have showcased their community through storytelling, participated in

a 2-day learning experience and workshops on storytelling, worked with their coaches to develop their individual projects, and will come together this summer to share and celebrate their completed project.
