It's a new year at Volunteer Manitoba. With new leadership, and new strategic goals, we're enthusiastically looking ahead to the future of the organization. and to supporting the non-profit sector across Manitoba.

The 2022-23 year was a great success for the organization, having seen an increase in the number of workshops we delivered across the province, as well as a rise in the amount of community outreach events we attended. With the easing of covid-19 restrictions, we were able to return to high schools and post-secondary institutions across Manitoba to raise awareness about the importance of volunteering in the community. We also launched a very successful Community Youth Innovators program, which supported some amazing young Manitobans to become more engaged in their communities.

Ashley Seymour joined the Volunteer Manitoba team in March 2023 as the **new Executive Director**. taking over from Jackie Hunt who served as the organization's leader for the past 5 years. Jackie made

an incredible impact on the organization during her tenure, and we wish her the best of luck in her future endeavours. Ashley brings many years of experience working in the non-profit sector, as well as a passion for volunteerism, and connecting with Manitobans. "Having lived in rural Manitoba my entire life, I believe an opportunity exists to bring that perspective to

the table", says Ashley. "I have seen firsthand how volunteerism builds strong, vibrant communities, and I look forward to supporting the work of Volunteer Manitoba and engaging with nonprofits all across the province".

The development of a new strategic plan for the organization is underway.

and we're looking to strengthen the capacity of non-profits to thrive in this "post-pandemic" era, by ensuring our strategic goals align with the needs of the sector. We're looking to increase training opportunities, and to ensure the training is relevant and responsive to the current trends that exist within the sector. We're planning to build upon existing partnerships, increase collaboration, identify opportunities for volunteer recruitment and engagement, and to expand our outreach to different communities and schools across the province. The Board of Directors have also adopted a 'Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion' philosophy, and our future work shall be guided by these principles to ensure we're acknowledging and supporting our diverse communities. The VM team will be working through the strategic plan over the summer months and expect to unveil the final version in Fall of 2023.

The planning has commenced for the 40th anniversary of the Annual Volunteer Awards, which are slated to take place during National Volunteer Week in April 2024. The awards recognize the remarkable work done by volunteers across Manitoba and have been celebrated virtually for the past three years. We are delighted to be planning an in-person event to celebrate this incredible milestone, and to recognize exceptional volunteers in the presence of their colleagues, dignitaries, media, sponsors, and supporters - just the way they deserve to be acknowledged! Nominations will be launched in November 2023, and we encourage everyone to nominate that incredible volunteer you know who dedicates their time and energy towards bettering their community.

TRAINING

Throughout the year, Volunteer Manitoba delivers effective, relevant and engaging training for boards, staff and volunteers.

Training Highlights from 2022-23

We are thrilled to share some of the highlights from the last year:

On the Road Again

We were finally able to get back on the road for some much needed in person training outside of Winnipeg! We were able to get to Boissevain, Portage la Prairie, Souris-Glenwood, Brandon and Thompson.

Back to In-Person

We brought back in person workshops and partnered with **Sport** Manitoba to hold our workshops at their facility. It has been wonderful working with them to provide high quality, in person training

Women and Board Governance

This year we hosted two Board Governance series with women lead organizations who focus on empowering women. Infinity Women Secretariat (a program of the Manitoba Metis Federation) and the Canadian Muslim Women's Institute combined hosted 65 women from across Manitoba and 12 workshops on board governance.

Series with Leading4Impact

We partnered with Leading4impact (formally Health in Common) to host a Planning and Evaluation Foundations Series. This series was a perfect introduction to data collection, design surveys, focus groups, interviews and excel.

Executive Directors Breakfast

We are currently part of the **Capacity Builders Working Group** with United Way Winnipeg, Mediation Services, Leading4Impact, and Canadian Community Economic Development Network -Manitoba. This collaboration provides an excellent opportunity to share sector insights, plans, and discuss building a more cohesive capacity building ecosystem. We successfully piloted an Executive Directors Breakfast event, where over 60 Executive Directors joined us and many others were on the waitlist.

Record Number – 103 Workshops!

This year, we celebrate a record number of workshops, 103! Our capacity has increased with the addition of Mia Penner-Adamo, a full-time Administrative Assistant who has been crucial in supporting the Training Department. We introduced new topics such as Board Evaluation, Volunteer Recruitment through a Rural Lens, and Trauma-Informed Leadership. The non-profit sector has experienced significant changes due to the pandemic and economic shifts, leading to an increased demand for training as new volunteers and staff enter the sector.

VM YOUTH PROGRAM

The VM Youth Program engages with young people between the ages of 15 and 30, providing the tools and resources to inspire their involvement in communities through volunteerism.

Our Youth Program has proven itself to be a valuable resource for youth, organizations, educators, parents, and communities throughout the province by:

- Sharing information on the benefits of volunteering both to the individual and the community.
- Educating agencies and communities on the best way to involve youth and young adults in volunteering.



Thanks to the generous support of Canada Life we reach thousands of youth each year.



STUDENT RECRUITMENT

This year, we successfully brought back our in-person Student Recruitment Fairs after a hiatus since 2019. We partnered with a record number of post-secondary schools across the province, including the University of Winnipeg, University of Manitoba, Manitoba Institute of Trades and Technology, l'Université de Saint-Boniface, Red River College, University College of the North-The Pas Campus, and Brandon University.

Additionally, we expanded our fair locations beyond Winnipeg, hosting a fair in Brandon and The Pas. Both fairs were highly successful, and our partners agreed to continue the partnership next year.

With over 50 organizations participating, each fair sold out and had a waitlist. The urgency for non-profits to attend these fairs was evident, as many of them face a shortage of volunteers to sustain their programs.

In Summer 2022, we launched the VM Community Youth **Innovators (CYI) Program**, providing youth with the opportunity to lead innovative community projects tailored for their peers! This program engaged diverse and passionate youth groups from across Manitoba, offering training in project management, volunteer engagement, marketing, and strategic planning. Participants gained experiential learning and expanded their network!

The program welcomed groups of 3 to 6 members, aged 18 to 29, residing in Manitoba with youth-led community ideas. Applications were accepted from November 2021 to January 2022, followed by a selection process that resulted in funding six projects with \$5000 each. These projects included:

- 1. Da Mino Matisichic (To learn the good way)
- 2. Fimbu Soccer and Mentorship
- 3. Accessible Sport Awareness
- 4. Helping CommUNITY204 (Hydration Station)
- 5. Newcomer Youth Networking & Literacy Support
- 6. Personal Finance for Black Youth

From the evaluation report we received, this program was useful and timely for youth as we gradually move out of the virtual phase of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Over 551 volunteer hours reported from this program!





We engaged with 2,004 YOUTH. through virtual outreach activities!

Many youth have an increased sense of awareness and commitment to volunteerism after participating with one saying, "... helping to give back to the community brings joy and warms my heart. [I will] definitely continue to work in community. Volunteering is a good way to use your time and get experience. I really enjoyed my time doing this. Look forward to other opportunities to help out in community.
