Volunteer Manitoba's online platform continues to be a vital resource for individuals seeking opportunities to get involved, having thousands of Manitobans turn to us to find volunteer opportunities that align with their interests, values and skills. Non-profit organizations relied on our resources to support their volunteer recruitment, enhance their operations, and ultimately strengthen their impact in community. Many also benefited from participating in our various volunteer recruitment fairs, where they connected directly with potential volunteers, raised awareness

about their mission, and built relationships that contributed to ongoing engagement and organizational growth.

With generous support from The Winnipeg Foundation, Volunteer Manitoba was able to develop new, responsive training programs tailored to the evolving needs of the non-profit sector. This funding also allowed us to offer subsidies, making it possible for organizations—particularly those with limited budgets—to access high-quality training at a reduced cost. By removing financial barriers, we created more equitable access to capacity-building opportunities, ensuring that a wider range of non-profit staff and volunteers could participate, learn, and apply new skills to strengthen their organizations and better serve their communities.

We continued to build on our sector-wide initiatives, including our Board Connect program to support organizations in their board recruitment, our networking events that brought together volunteer engagers and non-profit leaders to share best practices, discuss challenges, and build peer support, and launching the pilot of our mentorship program for volunteer managers. These initiatives were vital in fostering stronger relationships in the sector, building a shared purpose and sense of community among those leading volunteer-driven organizations.



This year, we were also proud to contribute to the development of Canada's National Volunteer Action Strategy—a pan-Canadian initiative aimed at creating a shared vision for volunteerism. Our engagement in this work helped ensure Manitoba's voice was represented in shaping a future where volunteering is inclusive, accessible, and sustainable for all. The strategy aligns with our ongoing commitment to advocate for systemic changes that recognize and support the value of volunteer contributions.

Throughout the year, we witnessed Manitobans step up in extraordinary ways—responding to community needs, supporting grassroots initiatives, and showing up with compassion and commitment. Whether it was mentoring youth, supporting local events and fundraising initiatives, helping at food banks, or serving on non-profit boards, volunteers made a lasting impact throughout our province. THE VM WEBSITE

Our website has been a great resource for Manitobans looking for volunteer opportunities. The website serves as the first point of contact and shows up as the number one item in Google searches for “Places to volunteer in Manitoba” and “Where to volunteer in Winnipeg”. For Newcomers, our website eliminates the quest to decipher between a non-profit/ charitable organization versus a for-profit organization because we vet and approve all positions we host on our website.

In the past year, the website (**VolunteerManitoba.ca**) reached **702,349 page views**. Volunteer opportunities are posted by hundreds of organizations across Manitoba every year!

REFERRALS

With the support of our volunteers and intern students, we have been able to recommend volunteer opportunities to individuals and groups looking for places to volunteer based on their areas of interest. In this fiscal year alone, we were able to support **570 individuals** to navigate our website to find places to volunteer! Our volunteer program has greatly supported our referral services by completing referrals in a shorter timeframe and **increasing the number of referrals by 50%!**

NATIONAL VOLUNTEER ACTION STRATEGY

This year, Volunteer Manitoba was proud to play an integral role in the development of Canada's first **National Volunteer Action Strategy**, led by **Volunteer Canada**.

Our role in this national initiative focused on amplifying the voices of Manitobans—ensuring that the unique perspectives, challenges, and opportunities experienced by local volunteers and organizations were reflected in the national dialogue. Through community consultations, focus groups, and targeted outreach, we gathered insights from non-profit leaders, volunteer managers, and volunteers themselves. These conversations helped shape the strategy's priorities around equity and inclusion, access to meaningful volunteer opportunities, and removing barriers to participation.

The National Volunteer Action Strategy is a critical step forward in recognizing the value of volunteerism in Canada and providing a coordinated approach to supporting the sector. As the Strategy continues to move forward, we remain dedicated to continuing this important work — advocating for the tools, resources, and recognition that volunteers and volunteer-involving organizations need to thrive, and that Manitoba's vibrant volunteer sector has a strong voice at the table.

TRAINING FOR THE NON-PROFIT & CHARITABLE SECTOR

This past year was a tremendous success for our training department. From 2024 to 2025, we delivered **117 Workshops**, equipping **1,772** staff and volunteers across the sector with new skills, stronger networks, and greater confidence in their roles.



Subsidy Program: Expanding Access to Training!

Thanks to the generous support of **The Winnipeg Foundation**, we were able to offer subsidized training to non-profits across Manitoba. This funding made it possible for **63 organizations** to access professional development opportunities that would have otherwise been out of reach.

Many of the recipients were small organizations with fewer than three staff — and some were entirely volunteer-run. This support helped strengthen the skills of staff and volunteers in their vital roles.

Subsidized Group Training

We also offered non-profits the opportunity to apply for private, customized workshops tailored to their teams. Through this initiative, **20 organizations** received training designed to meet their specific needs.

Customized Training

These customized sessions were especially meaningful, as they allowed us to deliver relevant, impactful training that reflected each organization's unique goals and challenges, at a reduced cost.

Advanced Learning Opportunities

This year, we responded to sector feedback that were asking for more advanced workshops. This meant with the support from **The Winnipeg Foundation**, we launched new high-level offerings including the following:

Media Training for Non-Profit Leaders, facilitated by **Nicole Dub  **. The session sold out so quickly, we added a second day—which also sold out.

We developed a brand-new **Advanced Non-Profit Leadership Training** workshop in partnership with **Kevin Freedman**. Originally planned as a single cohort pilot, overwhelming interest led to two full cohorts in Fall 2024.

Recognizing the resurgence of in-person events, we introduced **Event Planning for Non-Profit Leaders**, helping organizations build their event-planning capacity.

With AI making waves across every industry, we created a non-profit specific **AI workshop** with **Josefina Bilotta** that explores how community organizations can effectively use AI.

We also partnered with **Volunteer Toronto** to bring advanced volunteer management training to Manitoba, helping local leaders grow their programs.



Mentorship for Volunteer Engagers

To support the next generation of volunteer coordinators, we piloted a mentorship program that connects seasoned volunteer engagers with newer professionals in the field. Early interest has been strong, and we are excited to grow this initiative.

We also launched a blog series titled **Behind the Scenes: Real Stories of Volunteer Engagement in the Community**, celebrating the incredible work of volunteer engagers across Manitoba. Visit our blog to read these inspiring stories!

Let’s Keep Networking

After launching **Executive Director Breakfasts** and **Breakfast Bites & Volunteer Manager Insights** last year, we were thrilled to see continued momentum.

Over 80 Executive Directors joined us to share stories and leadership strategies. We also hosted for the first time an **Executive Director Luncheon in Brandon!**

More than 40 Volunteer Engagers participated in conversations about best practices for volunteer programs.

BOARD EVALUATION PUBLIC TRAINING

VM YOUTH PROGRAM

Our Youth Program has proven itself to be a valuable resource for youth, organizations, educators, parents, and communities throughout the province. Our youth program includes Student Recruitment, Youth Outreach and Presentations, Volunteer Program and Referrals.

This year our program engaged participants from underrepresented communities, including Indigenous youth, youth with disabilities, and those from remote regions. With support from partners like New Directions, R.B. Russell Vocational School, and Southeast Collegiate, we delivered presentations tailored to these groups. We also worked with HOODFAMS, helping youth in conflict with the law explore community reintegration options.

We continue to expand our digital resources, regularly updating our scholarships and bursaries webpage and sharing youth-focused content through our Instagram and blog, including our Fun Fact Fridays series.

STUDENT RECRUITMENT

Student Recruitment is a yearly undertaking that allows non-profit organizations and students to interact and potentially match up to volunteer.

We partnered with the following post-secondary schools including Brandon University, University of Manitoba, Manitoba Institute of Trades and Technology, l'Université de Saint-Boniface, Red River College Exchange District and Notre Dame Campuses and the University of Winnipeg.

We conducted a survey to understand non-profit representatives' perspectives on the student recruitment fairs we host. We asked them about the value they gained from these fairs. 88% of representatives stated that the Student Recruitment Fairs provided them with the opportunity to network with other organizations!
